Directions to WWM:

From Ligonier Diamond: Follow Route 711 South to the intersection of Route 30. Continue on Route 711 South for 3.2 miles. Turn left onto the Rector-Darlington Road. See below for directions from the Rector- Darlington Road.

From Donegal Turnpike Exit # 9: Follow signs for Route 711 North. Follow Route 711 North for 8.8 miles. Turn right onto the Rector-Darlington Road.

From the Rector-Darlington Road:

Go 1 mile and then turn right just before the bridge onto Route 381 South. Follow Route 381 South for 2.5 miles and then make a right onto Allen Road. Continue 0.3 miles and make a right onto Keslar Road. Travel 0.2 miles to arrive at the Wilderness Wildlife Museum.
